GRADING POLICY: This class has four major components from which your grade will be based
PARTICIPATION: You are expected to show up on time and prepared everyday and be willing to participate in class discussions and activities. Each and every one of us has something to bring to this class and everyone shall have the opportunity to contribute and express their opinions in a safe environment. Your attitude is key in participation, so please choose a good one! Participation points will be based on your engagement and effort in class activities, discussion and lectures.

CLASSWORK AND HOMEWORK (NOTEBOOK): Almost everything we do in this class, including lecture notes, activities, worksheets and homework will be done in a spiral notebook. Each page will be dedicated to a certain assignment and credit will be based on the completion of your notebook. Homework will either be collected or checked/stamped on a daily basis. Homework that is kept in your notebook will only receive full credit if it has a stamp on it. Notebooks will be graded at the end of each unit.

PROJECTS: There will be a few select projects during the course of the semester. You will learn more about them as they approach and each will have a different point value. Projects play a large part in this class and will add to your understanding of historical events and develop skills in research and analysis while having a little bit of fun.

QUIZZES /TESTS: A major form of assessment will come in quizzes and tests, which in most cases will test your understanding of ideas and events, rather than specific people and dates. Quizzes are generally 15-30 points and Tests are usually 80-100 points. We will usually have a test at the end of each unit, unless another form of assessment (such a as a project) is used.

## Grades will be categorized and weighted as follows:

- Homework and Classwork (including participation) - 45\%
- Assessments (unit test, quizzes, projects, midterm/final exam) - 55\%

FINAL GRADES will be based on the following percentages of points earned:

Google Classroom: Every student is required to join Google Classroom and enroll in our class. This is where you will have access to many course documents, homework, powerpoints and calendars. You will have some assignments to complete on Google Classroom and when you are absent you must check to see what you missed! How to enroll: login with your student email make sure you select I am a student click the plus button to join a class and enter the code for your class period ONLY. ## LATE WORK/ ABSENCES:

- Late work for absences will only receive credit if the absence is excused.
- If an assignment was due the date of an absence it must be turned in or stamped on the day the student returns, or it will not receive full credit. It's your responsibility to remember to turn it in or get a stamp.
- A student who has a valid excuse for a multiple day absence has the same number of days to make up work covered during absence.
- If absent, it is the student's responsibility to check Google Classroom, with another student (for an idea of what you missed ONLY) and with the teacher to obtain missed work. Do not assume that you can copy what you missed from a friend, most likely that will result in a zero for you both.
- If you miss a quiz or test you must take it at lunch on the make-up date. If you fail to show for the test make up, you will earn a zero for the test/quiz. Be sure to check Google Classroom for the date!
- If an absence is unexcused you will receive a zero for any missed classwork, quiz or test.
